Noranda Cross Country

Cross Country season is upon us!

Noranda Primary School will be holding our Faction Cross-Country event on Friday 24th May (Week 6). Our aim is to provide a course for students to test their resilience whilst helping to build their sustained running ability. Students will be running a traditional Cross-Country course in and around Noranda Primary School. The students in Year 3 and 4 will run a 1.5 km course whilst the students in Year 5 and 6 will be running a 2 km course. Over the next 3 weeks, during Physical Education lessons, the students will be preparing for this event.

The Cross-Country event will be held in the morning. Year 3 students will kickstart the morning, with each year group following in consecutive order. Each race is expected to take approximately 10-15

minutes inclusive of presentations. We welcome you to come along, get involved and support all participants. In the case of wet weather, a postponement date will be communicated.

Here is a timetable of how the day will run:

Please note that these times are only approximates. We may run ahead or behind scheduled times.

Gear:

Please make sure your child is well prepared for the day with all the following essentials:

- Students may wear their faction school polos
- Suitable running shoes (no bare feet)
- Appropriate running shorts
- Sunscreen (we will be providing sunscreen, but please apply in the morning)
- Drink bottle (named and full of water)

The Noranda Primary School Cross Country event will be used as a qualifier for the Guildford and Coolbinia Interschool Cross Country competitions. The first 5 male and female students to finish in each year group will qualify for the squad. Further information will be given to those students after the event.

Enrolments 2025

Registrations are invited for **Kindergarten** and **Pre-Primary** (not already enrolled at Noranda PS Kindergarten) for 2025. Application forms are available from the office between 9:00am and 2:00pm.

Children born between 1 July 2020 to 30 June 2021 are eligible for Kindergarten.

Applications close Friday 19 July 2024.

You will be asked to show your child's Birth Certificate (original or certified copy) or birth extract or equivalent identity documents; your child's Australian Immunisation Register (AIR) Immunisation History Statement (downloaded through myGov); proof of your child's usual place of residence e.g. utilities account, lease agreement, statutory declaration and copies of any Family Court or other court orders, and visa details (if applicable).

Principals may accept a maximum of 3 documents as evidence of your child's usual residential address. Principals are able to request additional information where this is necessary to confirm your child's usual place of residence.

You will need to provide evidence of your child's current immunisation status when you lodge an application to enrol. You can provide one of the following:

- Australian Immunisation Register (AIR) Immunisation History Statement that is not more than two months old; or
- Australian Immunisation Register (AIR) Immunisation History Form for children on a catch-up schedule that is not more than six months old; or
- Immunisation Certificate issued by the Chief Health Officer.

Other immunisation documents are no longer accepted.

Once the application has been accepted, you will be required to complete an Enrolment Form. If your Application for Enrolment is not accepted, you will be advised in writing within three weeks of the advertised closing date for applications.

This is also the time to enrol your child to High School for Year 7 for 2025.
