Loose Parts Play Collection Drive

The Pre Primary teachers are keen to re-establish loose parts play in their play area. Our current loose parts supplies are quite depleted, so we are having a collection drive beginning tomorrow. So please raid your kitchen cupboards, garage storage areas, sheds and anywhere else that you may have some potential unwanted items lying around that could become loose parts treasures.

What: Loose Parts Play Collection Drive

When: Friday 31st May to Friday 7th June

Where: Outside of the front office – in the collection box

Bring: Donations of loose parts, for example:

- Cardboard, e.g. large cardboard boxes from buying a fridge, TV or washing machine and long, strong cardboard tubes;
- Kitchen utensils, e.g. old saucepans, wooden spoons, muffin tins, oven trays, old beaters and other electronic items, scales and plastic utensils;
- Outdoor equipment, e.g. tarps, ropes, garden netting, crates, pool noodles, inner tubes from bikes with the valve cut out, picnic blankets, measuring tapes, PVC pipes, joiners or plastic guttering pieces, small balls that can roll down through pipes (not golf balls), electric cable reels, witches hats and road signs;
- Dress ups, e.g. hard hats, boots, walking sticks, headphones, walkie talkies, crutches and bandages.
- Old household items, e.g. sheets, material, cushions, old vacuums and clocks; and
- Anything else you can think of!

Noranda Nippers

Noranda Primary School has run a very successful Storytime program for several years called 'Noranda Nippers'.

The program runs on **Mondays** from 9:00-10:00am in Room 16. This weekly program is for children 4 years and under. All local families are welcome to attend. Mrs Cohen will run the group and provide suitable activities for children.

We also provide a variety of information sessions from professionals including Early Childhood experts, speech therapists, occupational therapists, nutritionists, health nurse and more!

Fees are \$2 per child per session. These fees will cover the cost of supplies used to run the program.

Enrolments 2025

Registrations are invited for **Kindergarten** and **Pre-Primary** (not already enrolled at Noranda PS Kindergarten) for 2025. Application forms are available from the office between 9:00am and 2:00pm.

Children born between 1 July 2020 to 30 June 2021 are eligible for Kindergarten.

Applications close Friday 19 July 2024.

You will be asked to show your child's Birth Certificate (original or certified copy) or birth extract or equivalent identity documents; your child's Australian Immunisation Register (AIR) Immunisation History Statement (downloaded through myGov); proof of your child's usual place of residence e.g. utilities account, lease agreement, statutory declaration and copies of any Family Court or other court orders, and visa details (if applicable).

Principals may accept a maximum of 3 documents as evidence of your child's usual residential address. Principals are able to request additional information where this is necessary to confirm your child's usual place of residence.

You will need to provide evidence of your child's current immunisation status when you lodge an application to enrol. You can provide one of the following:

- Australian Immunisation Register (AIR) Immunisation History Statement that is not more than two months old; or
- Australian Immunisation Register (AIR) Immunisation History Form for children on a catch-up schedule that is not more than six months old; or
- Immunisation Certificate issued by the Chief Health Officer.

Other immunisation documents are no longer accepted.

Once the application has been accepted, you will be required to complete an Enrolment Form. If your Application for Enrolment is not accepted, you will be advised in writing within three weeks of the advertised closing date for applications.

This is also the time to enrol your child to High School for Year 7 for 2025.

Faction Tokens

Faction points are earned for positive behaviour in the classroom and the playground. At the end of each term, students in the winning faction receive a prize.

Term 2 progressive point count is 1st Gold 20, 2nd Red 16 and 3rd Blue and Green 10.
