Reporting to Parents

The Department of Education has provided clarification of the requirements for end-of-semester reports. In light of this information, we will be reviewing our school's assessment and reporting plan. If we identify possible changes to our current approach, which I highly suspect we will, we will share these changes with parents in Week 3 next term at an Open Board Meeting, P&C Meeting and in the Week 3 newsletter. As you may have heard in the media, this announcement was made by the Education Minister, Minister Buti last week in the interest of addressing the unnecessary workload challenges faced by teachers and school leaders of many schools' current reporting practices.

Student Dress Code

Our School Board met last week and endorsed an update of the Student Dress Code. The Dress Code has been updated with staff, Board and Year 5 and 6 student input. The changes to the previous policy are around clarification of jewellery and footwear as well as the addition of a plain black long sleeve shirt which can be worn under student logo polo shirts. I would also like to draw parent's attention to the short, skorts and long pants section, these should be loose fitting and not active wear, we have seen an increase in students wearing bike shorts and leggings and these do not fall within the dress code. We will allow families the remainder of this year to work within these guidelines as purchases are made with everyone expected to be compliant with shorts and pants for 2025. Open School Board Meeting


The next School Board Meeting will be an open meeting, and any parents are welcome to attend. The meeting is on Wednesday October 23 at 5.30pm in the staffroom. This is an opportunity for parents to gain an understanding of the Board's purpose and activities.

Angkor Project

The Department of Education WA has an opportunity for school to join with disadvantaged schools in Cambodia through the Angkor project sister school program. The purpose of this is to provide some financial and educational support for these schools and to grow the awareness and understanding in our students about challenges faced in other parts of the world, growing their civic

responsibility. In the January holiday, I visited one of these schools on an Education Department group Study Tour. During these two weeks in Cambodia, I visited various areas and taught in our now sister school for three days. In this time, I taught classes with up to 60 student per room from 7am to 5pm. Some classrooms had electricity and others did not, there were open floors, two toilets for 670 students and 20 staff and limited resources in classrooms. Most students had a pencil each and that was all. Our plan is to now do one or two fundraisers per year with funds going directly to our sister school. The funds raised on next Friday's free dress will go there as well as a second hand toy sale that we will do on Tuesday and Wednesday next week. If you have any toys your children have outgrown in good condition, please bring them to my office and we can prepare the goods for sale before school and at lunch on Tuesday and Wednesday as well as at the Open Night. Staff Carpark


Please respect the signage and do not enter the staff carpark. Students should not be moving within this space because they have been dropped off or collected.




