#### **Awards Assembly**

Tomorrow's assembly is our annual awards assembly where students are selected by their teachers for awards. If your child has been selected, you will have received an email from Mrs Rullo. As we have for the past couple of years, we have Anne Murphy presenting the Jeff Murphy Citizenship Award to one student. The instrumental music students will be performing for us and we will announce the 2025 Student Councillors for Semester One and the two School Captains. The prospective councillors did their speeches last Friday morning in front of their voters from Years 3-6 and staff. The speeches this year were of an extremely high calibre and I congratulate them all on their speeches.

#### Graduation

The Graduation ceremony is next Wednesday 11 December for our Year 6 students. This will commence at the start of school and be followed by a morning tea on the grassed area outside the undercover area with all Year 6's and guests. Morning tea will be provided by the Year 6 parents and can kindly be delivered to the staffroom before school on Wednesday.

Following the morning tea, Year 6's are able to get ready (change into smart casual clothes, hair down etc) for Graduation Lunch and they can do so at school, or parents can take them home. Students are required to be ready and at school for the bus leaving at 11:30am. Graduands will then have lunch at the Atrium at Crown and be returned to school via bus for collection at the end of day at 3pm.

As I have communicated in previous newsletters, we have several new staff commencing at Noranda in 2025. Our new teaching staff joined our current teachers in planning sessions earlier this week and had the opportunity to familiarise themselves with Noranda throughout the day they were here. They are all very keen to get started at Noranda and work with our students.




## **Faction Points**
