#### Wellbeing Officer / Breakfast Club

Unfortunately, Ms Rae our wellbeing officer last year, has left the role to work in a different field. I wish her well in her new job. We are currently working through applicants from Anglicare to take over this position. Once this process is finished, I will share who will be joining our school. Breakfast Club is led by our Wellbeing Officer, so once we are staffed, this will re-commence.

#### **ECU Practicum Students**

We have two students from ECU who are part of the HAT@ECU program. This program runs like an internship for teaching students for two years. These two staff members are working through their Masters in Education which is where they already have a university degree but are now training as teachers. Mrs Hanley and Mrs Wells will be working in our Early Childhood classrooms, from Kindy to Year 2 on Monday and Tuesday each week.

#### NAPLAN

NAPLAN National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is held in schools across Australia to provide a consistent collection of data indicating student achievement. NAPLAN is an annual assessment for all students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. It tests the types of skills that are essential for every child to progress through school and life. The tests cover skills in reading, writing, spelling, grammar and punctuation, and numeracy. The assessments are undertaken every year and the NAPLAN testing period begins this year on March 12th. If you would like to view the assessments to show your child at home there is public demonstration site for you to view and work through some sample test items with your child, which may assist in alleviating any anxiety they, or you, may be feeling. This can be found at: NAP - Public demonstration site. Classroom Teachers will provide opportunities to practice test situations within the classroom to support students. Please remember this a dipstick assessment of your child's progress and is just one of the measures we draw from in measuring your child's achievement. An information flyer will be provided for students in Years 3 and 5 with more detailed information.

#### **School Grounds**

We are finding the upkeep of our school grounds very challenging without a gardener three days per week. As you will see, our garden beds, edges and the build up of leaves are not looking the best. We have also had the additional issue with the bore which supports all sprinklers having technical issues that no external contractors could remedy until last week. So, we should see our green grass return soon. If any parents have the ability to assist with any minor gardening volunteering, we would appreciate it.

Should you choose to pay this amount electronically please state the student's surname-Spelling in the reference area. A receipt will be issued on request.


