# Principal's Report

Dear Families,

## **Student Census**

We recently had our Student Census for the start of the year. From our census, our student numbers and characteristics are shared with the Department of Education. From this information, the funding we receive to manage Noranda Primary School for 2025 is calculated. Based on our Census day, we have 350 students enrolled for 2025.

## **NAPLAN**

On Wednesday of next week, our Year Three and Five students will begin their NAPLAN testing. It would be appreciated if parents could limit appointments to outside of school within the NAPLAN testing period so that students can sit the assessments in their class with their peers.

## After school pick up

Parents are reminded to please collect their children promptly if they are picking them up from school. There is no supervision of students after the siren at 3pm, so parents are responsible for their children. Students are not permitted to play on the playgrounds after school due to the lack of supervision and insurance. It would be great if parents could support this. Students are well aware they should not be playing on equipment after school. If you are not able to collect your children or have them make their own way home, we have an out of school care provider who is here to support families both before and after school.

## **Parent concerns**

I would like to remind families of the actions to be taken if there is a situation you are not happy with involving another student in the school. Please do not address your concerns directly to a student as it is not appropriate for parents to be telling students off for any reason. If you do feel there is an issue that needs to be attended to, please advise one of the Associate Principals or myself so that we can investigate and address any concerns. It is our role to support and work with students to address misdemeanours or concerning behaviour and we want to maintain the student's safety at school. Noranda Primary School proudly supports a sister school in Cambodia, Ang Serey Primary School. We began this initiative last year and held a fundraiser second hand toy sale with all profits sent to Ang Serey. I am really excited to share that from the fundraising we did, we have now provided effective toilet blocks for the 680 students and staff. They have also been

able to install a large water tank, so they aren't bringing in drinking and hand washing water into the school daily via motorcycle.

In 2025, the Noranda PS School Board will be leading this civic and community initiative. The main fundraising and awareness activity will be on Angkor awareness Day on Friday March 28th. On this day, all 34 West Australian sister schools are holding awareness events for their sister schools in Cambodia. The School Board, led by parent members will be facilitating a fun foam activity for all students from Year 1 to 6. For a gold coin (or greater) donation, students will participate in an hour of fun themed around water and of course the foam station on the oval. Students are encouraged to wear their faction shirts as they will rotate through stations in their factions. We will also raise funds through a raffle.
